

Statement of website accessibility for private

Statement

Compliance status:

Partially compliant

This website is partially compliant with the requirements of Annex A of the UNI CEI EN 301549 standard. This is due to the following points of non-compliance:

Non-accessible content

The content listed below is not accessible for the following reasons: non-compliance with Italian Law No. 4 of 9 January 2004:

- Requirement: 9.1.1.1 - Some non-text content presented to the user has no equivalent textual alternative that serves the same purpose;
- Requirement: 9.1.3.1 - In some cases, information, structure, and relationships conveyed through presentation cannot be programmatically determined (or are not available in text);
- Requirement: 9.1.3.2 - In some cases, when the sequence in which the content is presented affects its meaning, the sequence is just visual and not structural;
- Requirement: 9.1.4.1 - In some cases, colour has been used as the only means of identifying a purpose or distinguishing information or function;
- Requirement: 9.1.4.3 - The visual representation of text and images of text does not always have the required minimum contrast ratio, with the exceptions provided for in the regulations (e.g. logos);
- Requirement: 9.1.4.4 - Certain texts, with the exception of captions and images of text, cannot be resized without assistive technology up to 200 percent without loss of content or functionality;
- Requirement: 9.1.4.5 - In some cases, images of text have been used instead of text alone and are neither customisable nor essential to the type of information conveyed;
- Requirement: 9.1.4.10 - Content that does not need to be displayed in two dimensions (such as data tables or maps) does not rearrange when the size displayed by the user programme changes;
- Requirement: 9.1.4.11 - For some essential components, even in different states, the contrast ratio against adjacent colours does not exceed 3:1;
- Requirement: 9.1.4.12 - There is some loss of information or content when changing line height, paragraph, letter or word spacing;
- Requirement: 9.2.1.1 - Some functions are not operable through a keyboard (or interface with similar input);
- Requirement: 9.2.2.1 - There is a time-dependent element or event for which none of the following is possible: turn off time limit before it is reached, adjust limit, cannot be extended at least ten times, user is not warned before time expires, unless exceptions are provided for in legislation;
- Requirement: 9.2.2.2 - For certain moving, blinking, scrolling or auto-updating information that starts automatically, lasts longer than five seconds or is presented in parallel with other content, there are no mechanisms to pause, stop or hide it;
- Requirement: 9.2.4.1 - No mechanism is available to bypass blocks of content that are repeated on multiple Web pages;
- Requirement: 9.2.4.2 - Some web pages do not have titles describing their topic or purpose;

- Requirement: 9.2.4.3 - On some web pages that can be navigated sequentially and where the navigation sequences affect meaning or operation, some focusable components do not receive focus in an order that preserves meaning and operability;
- Requirement: 9.2.4.7 - On some interactive elements, the focus indicator is not visible;
- Requirement: 9.3.2.3 - Some of the navigational mechanisms that are repeated on multiple web pages within a set of web pages do not occur in the same relative order;
- Requirement: 9.3.2.4 - Some components that have the same functionality within a set of web pages are not identified consistently;
- Requirement: 9.3.3.1 - In some cases, when an input error is automatically detected, the item that is in error is not identified and/or the error is not described to the user in text;
- Requirement: 9.3.3.2 - In some cases, no labels or instructions are provided when content requires user input;
- Requirement: 9.3.3.3 - If an input error is automatically detected and suggestions for correction are known, then the suggestions are not provided to the user, apart from cases provided by the regulations;
- Requirement: 9.4.1.2 - In some cases, user interface components (including form elements, links and components generated by scripts), names, roles, states, properties and values are not correct or set, or the user and their assistive technologies are not notified when these change;
- Requirement: 9.4.1.3 - In some cases, status messages are not presented to the user in such a way that assistive technologies can interpret them without receiving focus;
- Requirement: 10.1.1.1 - Some non-text content presented to the user has no equivalent textual alternative that serves the same purpose;
- Requirement: 10.1.3.1 - In some cases, information, structure, and relationships conveyed through presentation cannot be programmatically determined (or are not available in text);
- Requirement: 10.2.4.2 - Some web pages do not have titles describing their topic or purpose;
